

Charter School Contract

This year we renewed our charter contract with the Scio School district for another ten years, the longest time legally allowed. Our new contract increases our State School funding allowance from 80% to 85%. We would like to thank all who were involved in the negotiation process.

GLOBE

The school joined the GLOBE program in 2002 and has been collecting atmospheric and hydrology data at the Lyons Fire Hall next to the school and the Hannah Bridge. Data from all the member schools is posted on the internet at globe.gov. Viewers from around the world can access this international data. Lourdes has presently posted 899,600 pieces of data.
